

CREATIVITY AND WEIRDOS

As with any business endeavor, hobby, or profession, one of the keys that often makes the endeavor artistic is creativity. Creativity is the process of assembling thoughts, ideas, original thinking and imagination to produce artistic work.

One might argue that creativity should be an entity in and of itself, and stand alone without the influence of others. Sounds good on paper, except that it is just not true. It is rarely possible to have uninfluenced creativity. Creativity must have a mechanism that drives it as a functional force. Something must inspire it. It must have matter upon which to draw new conclusions.

Often this power is the association of others. Simply put, people influence our creativity, and their connections is most often intense. Magicians usually stand on the thoughts and inspiration of predecessors. Magic is often a descendant of the insight of others.

My own performance of our magic art is so wound-up by the inspiration of others, it is virtually impossible to say how I got to where I am today. People wrote the magic books that influenced my early development in magic. It was the inspiration of the early stage illusionists I saw perform as a child that instilled within me my love for platform and stage magic.

My mentor such as the late Charlie Dodson of Midland, Texas was never a "finger flicker," and certainly never a card mechanic. I often wonder if his influence is the reason that while I like card magic, a lot of it doesn't seem to like me. All I know is that I rarely create new card tricks. But that is ok. I like where I stand. I feel confident with my Mental Photography and Dave's Decks. I can handle cards, do a few sleights, false shuffles, and can convincingly do some really good card forces. My card magic has served me well. Humm! Did Charlie's influence stifle my card creativity?

All this proves the point, where I have been creative, it has usually come from my friendships. I am so fortunate so have so many good friends. Yes, there have also been those times when I have asked myself, "What the heck are you doing with your strange friendships? Are your friendships really helping you with your creativity?" I mean honestly, sometimes I don't care much about my friends. Some of them even make me angry at times because a lot of them are weirdos. However I have a tendency to constantly "pull them back into my circle." I consider that part of my job is to befriend people, help them where I can, an be a positive influence. You know, it's that "love your neighbor as yourself" thing in action.

So I am happy where I am in magic for the moment. I try to be creative and yet I still look to my friends for inspiration. That is the beauty of having our great SAM Assembly 138 and Alliance of Illusionists magic clubs.

In the usual tradition here's an updated calculation for determining the day of the week for any day this year (2024). The fact it's a leap year necessitates an additional calculation for any day in January & February but by the time you're reading this, there will be only a couple weeks remaining so it's irrelevant. If you'd like to learn the full method of determining any date of any year and credits (Martin Gardner & Wallace Lee) I explain it in the June 2019 Servante. The following is a condensed method for ease of use for **this year only (2024)**.

Day of the Week Calculation for 2024 — This little math stunt can be quite useful in quickly determining the day of the week for any date given without the need for looking it up on your phone or calendar. Simply add the numeral value assigned with the month with the day, from the total cast out the 7s (meaning divide by 7) if the value is over 7 and use only <u>the remainder</u> to determine the day. If it's 7 or less use that value. **Note: If the day is prior to March 1 subtract one (1) from your total.**

Referring to the chart, the value next to each month is the numeral value for that particular month, next to it is a simple mnemonic for easy memorization, a couple run-throughs you'll have them down, they'll never change.

Party Mind Melter Math Magic— You'll need 30 or more somethings (peanuts, M&Ms, etc.) and 3 volunteers. The amount can be any but 30 provides a decent amount for what's about to transpire.

- Look away and instruct all 3 to take an <u>equal number</u> of peanuts, 3 minimum, and hide them. While they're
 doing this write on a napkin towards the top 'NONE', in the middle area of the napkin write 'NONE', and towards the napkins bottom write '4'. Roll the napkin upwards where each prediction is hidden individually.
- 2. Keeping your back towards them (or simply looking up and away) ask the person on the right to give <u>1</u> peanut to the middle person. Next instruct the person on the left to give <u>2</u> peanuts to the middle person. Ask the person on the right to count how many peanuts he/she has remaining and take that many from the middle person. Instruct both left and right to eat their peanuts. Turn back towards them.
- 3. Remind them you have no idea how many peanuts they began with but have made 3 predictions of their amounts. Unroll the napkin where the top prediction is visible and have the person on the right verify you're accuracy (a joke because they got eaten), unroll to the middle prediction and verify (joke again) with the person on the left. Lastly ask the middle person how many they have. They'll be expecting a 3rd joke revelation of some sort but will be surprised when they see you somehow correctly predicted the exact number they're hiding! Secret: No matter how many they start with the middle always will end with 4.




IMPROV COMEDY CLUBS IN ADDISON AND ARLINGTON
