#### **DECEMBER 2022 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES**

President Cindy Bighorse called to order the Thursday December 15, 2022 Executive Committee Meeting of the Alliance of Illusionists at about 6:00 pm on in the Museum Room of the Illusion Warehouse. A quorum was present with President Cindy Bighorse, Vice-President Bernie Trowbridge, Secretary Bruce Chadwick, Sergeant at Arms Joe Rotio, and Historian Lonnie Olander. Also in attendance was member in good standing Charley Montroll. Not in attendance were Member at Large Nikolas Alignay or Treasurer Mark Bynum.

The November Executive Committee minutes as presented in the November SERVANTE monthly assembly news-letter were approved as printed. With the absence of Treasurer Mark Bynum, a Treasurer's report was not presented. With the TAOM profit sitting in the club Operating (checking) Account, Joe Rotio made a motion that Bernie Trowbridge seconded that \$5000 be transferred from the club's Operating Account to the club's Edward Jones investment. The action was approved by vote of the Executive Committee.

The January Monthly Assembly Meeting will be the club's annual Installation Banquet. Scott and Judy Donaldson will entertain at the event. The club has paid a fee of \$600 for their performance fee, transportation, and hotel accommodations. Food for the event will be smoked brisket cooked by a company in Saginaw. The company will also provide the sides. Attendees will be asked to pay \$20 per person for their meal, help offset the entertainment expense, and provide a tip for the caterer.

The agenda for the December Christmas Party was discussed. Agenda includes finger foods, entertainment by Connor Branach, and the white elephant gift exchange.

The Nominating Committee comprised of Jimmie Fulce and Joe Rotio reported a potential list for 2023 club year officers. Suggested officers willing to serve include Bernie Trowbridge for President, Lonnie Olander as Vice-President, Bruce Chadwick as Secretary, Cindy Bighorse as Treasurer, Connor Branach for Sergeant at Arms, and Charley Montroll as Member at Large. ## **MAGIC VIOLIN**

A violinist played for 45 minutes in the New York subway. A handful of people stopped, a couple clapped, and the violinist raised about \$30 in tips.

No one knew, but the musician was one of the finest concerto violinists in the world. The success of any performer is often based upon the performing environment. An improper environment can cause even the greatest talents to be overlooked and undervalued. Even extraordinary performers usually don't shine in inadequate environments.

Similarly, there are brilliantly talented magicians everywhere who aren't receiving the recognition and reward they deserve because they play the wrong environments. If they can remove themselves from settings that aren't serving them, and instead seek environments that increase perception of value, the performer will usually shine beyond compare. While talent and a good act is important, proper frame is always important too.

Day of the Week Calculation for 2023 — I thought I'll begin this new year with a refresher of a formula I'd posted in the June, 2019 Servante pertaining to a method of calculating the day of the week for any given date. This little math stunt can be quite useful in quickly determine the day of the week which any date resides without the need for looking it up on your phone or calendar. You might even raise an eyebrow or 2. This year, 2023, is an easy one since the calculation for 2023 comes out totaling zero (0), therefore all that's required is to add the number assigned for the month and day, from that cast out the 7s (meaning divide by 7) and use just the remainder to determine the day. Refer to my original post for more.

Friday — 0, Saturday — 1, Sunday — 2, Monday — 3, Tuesday — 4, Wednesday — 5, Thursday — 6

Example: What day of the week is the 4th of July this year?

July month value = 0

Day of the month = 4

0 + 4 = 4 - Tuesday

Example: What day of the week will Christmas

fall on this year?

December month value = 6

Day of the month = 25

6 + 25 = 31

 $31 \div 7 = 4$  with a remainder of <u>3</u>—Monday

Remember, if the total is greater than 7, divide by 7 and use just the remainder to determine the day (like the 2nd example). If the total is less than 7, use that value (like the 1st example).

**IMAGINE, BELIEVE, ACHIEVE**— An inspirational coin I carry around has those 3 words inscribed on it. I realized something about those 3 words and came up with the following. The math principle is credited to Martin Gardner & Karl Fulves.

- 1. Holding the deck face down, double-turnover (tutorials online & at the club meetings), mention the card showing to be the random selection used for the trick. Double-turnover again, remove the top card and poke it into the lower middle of the deck somewhere. The spectator believes the selection to be lost in the middle when it's secretly on top. Ask for the person's name and deal that many cards to the table, 1 card per letter. The selection's now at the bottom of the dealt stack. Depending on their name you may need to deal some more to get the dealt stack between 8 13 cards total in order for the principle to work. It's doubtful the name will be larger than 13 letters & if less than 8, deal-spell 'Destiny', 'Luck', or other inspirational word as well to get the packet to within the 8—13 card range. Set the deck down and pick up the packet.
- 2. Spell 'IMAGINE' out loud and dealing 1 card to the table per letter. Drop the remainder of cards on top. Pick the packet back up. Repeat this spelling and dropping process, spelling 'BELIEVE' and one last time spelling 'ACHIEVE'. Pick up the packet and drop on the deck's top. Talk about how those 3 words can make anything possible & ask them to tap the top of the deck and turn over the top card. Enjoy their amazed reaction! The belief of the selection being much deeper in the deck than the packet used adds to the mystery, a double brain-smacker if you will.
