Jack McCoy did a very good job with a winners and losers type card effect he called Carnival. Unfortunately no matter what card the spectator chose, the victim seemed to always wind-up with the "loser card." His routine was fun and very entertaining. The incomparable George Ferrin then did his New Member Introduction with a very amazing card effect he called "Static," an effect closely related to the Haunted Deck type routine. George was then elected as our newest club member.

Hare Evison was next with three jumbo frogs, one of which croaked while the other two did not. Closely akin to the Rattle Bars effect, his routine was unique to say the least. He also performed a cup and ball routine with a coin climax. Our favorite magical electrician Caleb Westeen then did a fun card routine that was climaxed with the selected card affixed to his forehead!

George Ferrin came back a second time with his handling of the classic Fast and Loose chain effect. Matthew Welsby was next with a couple of iPhone type predictions with Argon and duality Pro cell phone apps. Discussion revolved on possible performers for the January 2026 Installation Banquet.


The committee then discussed the main core activities for the upcoming meetings. These include:

PARROTS

My wife nursed a baby cardinal from the eyes closed and no feathers stage all the way up until it was flying and it was time for the release. We set a cage on the porch. It would fly off in the day and return at night. People call this a soft release. I don't know what cats call this but the cardinal landed on the ground one day instead of the cage and the cat did what cats do.

Three days later my wife curtailed her mourned by coming home with a 30 or so year commitment known as a quaker parrot. The bird and I are now quite close. Her name is Nellie.

I very frequently say words and phrases to Nellie in an effort to get her to repeat them. Parrots are smart. They can learn to mimic and even learn appropriate times to use certain words or phrases. While the parrot does not spend any amount of thought about the words it says, sometimes it does come off as smarter than it actually is by this mimicking. Sometimes this is called parroting.

While parroting may make a bird look smart, when magicians do parroting, the results are not always favorable. Magicians should think about their words before they say them, and especially while performing. Unfortunately there are words that come out of magician's mouths only because they have heard other magicians say them. I guess parrots can teach parrots.


What is the best defense for magicians against saying things that are not fully thought out? Scripting! Scripting makes magicians think about the actual words they say, and hopefully examine what words are needed or not needed to produce an overall refined performance. Magicians become more genuine when they speak carefully chosen words, and smoother dialogue is the result.

Much could be and has been said about scripting, and so I will move along and suggest that magicians should start a list of "magician speak" things they would like to avoid. My list has grown over time. It is my list of things that I don't want to say for a variety of reasons and none of the phrases will likely make it into a routine with deliberately chosen words, but may accidentally end up in an unscripted performance. The list for other magicians will be different as per their reasoning.

I shall now ramble a bit of my list stuff with the little remaining space I am allowed. "So. Uhmm. Are you sure? Do you want to change your mind? Maybe you weren't watching close. Do I need to slow that down for you? Are you really sure? Does this seem fair? Do me a favor. Tell you what. Wrong."

Magicians should think about what they say and why they say it. While they should say what they want, they shouldn't be a parrot.





OH LORD, A DRUG LORD

Many years ago I had a very interesting performance experience. I got a call one day from a man wanting to book my services as a magician for a Saturday afternoon gathering at his ranch. That was fine. I needed the money.

It was the days of paper maps and well before the days of cell phones and the Internet. The man gave me very explicit directions over the landline phone and assured me I wouldn't have any trouble navigating to his estate.

I remember distinctly traveling from Fort Worth way up highway 287, past Decatur, Texas and into the abyss of pastureland. It was there that I turned off onto a farm market road, drove several miles, and then turned off on a small ranch road. I drove quite a ways until the pavement ceased, and a dirt road commenced. Finally I topped the hill and came down into a valley only to discover a big fence and a cattle gate with two very ominous looking men guarding its entrance.

The men looked like that they were candidates for the "Men in Black" movie. Yep, they were dressed in black suits, wearing white shirts and black ties. They also wore distinctive mirror sunglasses that police are apparently required to wear. Their authority was even more evident with their M-4's slung across their chests.

With my anxiety level running at about 110 percent, my first thoughts were that they were Secret Service and were guarding the entrance to some prominent politician's estate. One of the men waved me forward. In typical police stop fashion, I rolled down my car window. One of the men asked who I was. I told them I was the magician and showed them my driver's license as per their request. The men relaxed a bit and said that they were expecting me.

Pointing to their black Suburban (kid you not), one of the men said, "I'm going to drive down the road and you follow me." "Yessir!" I said distinctively. We proceeded to drive through the gate and down the road quite a ways, over another couple of hills and came to what I could only describe as a compound. The place had multiple buildings and was akin to some type of old west theatrical set. My nervousness lessened a bit when I saw numerous adults and children swarming about the area.

I parked my vehicle where I was directed. It was then that a short middle-aged heavyset Hispanic fellow walked over to me. He had a big gold tooth in his mouth, a large gold necklace draped around his neck, and a drink of some sort in his hand. I felt like I had met Scarface in person!

Fortunately the man was quite friendly and congenial. He explained that he was the one who had hired me and that I was to perform under the awning area that covered the picnic tables. He explained that there was lots of free food from the various vendors and that I should help myself. He also pointed out a row of three or four small cabins and confessed that each cabin had a girl inside. He explained that "If you are into that sort of thing, help yourself and it won't cost you anything."


The magic show went well, and Scarface was elated with my performance. He gave me a wad of cash and a hand-some tip. I thanked him profusely as I made haste and loaded my car. Forget the amenities. I was still a bit uneasy and wanted to leave. I drove out of the compound and was very pleased when I finally reached the highway. I pondered about the event all the way back home. It certainly was one performing experience I will never forget.

Important: From past experiences performing scary magic and which at times I've received very strong unnerved reactions, it's very important in stressing to your volunteer that what they're about to experience is only pretend, for their future piece of mind they not even jokingly imagine a real person they may know or know of, say a brother, boss or teacher. Certainty can easily become uncertainty at later times, and no one needs that on their conscience because of a trick they once saw and out of coincidence or the simple happenstance of time something did manage to happen to said person.

Effect: A packet of cards is shown and gone down through, the spectator making 3 choices (free) along the way in determining a final spot on a voodoo doll for poking with a needle, if there were truly a doll and needle. They see that each variation of choices determines a different location on the doll's body, yet when the final card of the packet is turned over they see a picture of a single voodoo doll and a needle jabbed into it at that very location. The packet is self-contained, there's no pocket indexing, magnetics, or sticky movable needle, it's actually part of the picture!

History: I wouldn't know where to begin crediting for the 'magician's choice (equivoque)' methodology and the 'double-turnover', which is basically the only 2 secrets taking place. Whether it's similar to another voodoo doll trick I haven't a clue.

Construction: Two pages from here are 9 images showing 3 sets of voodoo dolls, each set consisting of: 1 card with a question and 2 cards with color ball choices pertaining to that question. Cut out all 9 on that page, also the 'Sasha Already Knows' card on the next page from here, 3 pages away you'll need the legend' card which is the blurred doll with color ball combinations, and lastly 1 of the needle poked voodoo doll pictures.

Setup: Referring to the legend card, note the 3-color combination that's shown next to your chosen voodoo card's needle poke location. In this example, I've decided to use the doll with the needle in its foot. The 3 color combination on the legend card for the 'FOOT' are **white, orange, and green**.

- 1. Remember this mnemonic: "I'm myself, a boy (or girl) who wishes to live!" It should prove quite easy to remember.
- 2. Arrange each group of 3 (question card and 2 choice cards) where the question is on top (back), the sandwiched (middle) card has the ball 'force' colors for your chosen needle prick below **self, boy** (or **girl** if you're a girl), and **live**, and the re-

maining card on the face (note illustration). Stack them in question order, the Sasha title card goes on top, the legend card 2nd from bottom, and needled voodoo doll on bottom. You're ready so scare, I mean amaze!



My colors, white, orange, and green are below SELF, BOY, and LIVE and the middle card of each trio (orange brackets).

The cards are dealt in the fashion common to cartomancy (playing card fortune telling), where the cards are removed from the front by the thumb on top and fingers below (A). The thumb drags the top card forward where it and the fingers can pinch the front edge.

Remove the card from the front, rotating it face up as the right hand places it on the table in front of the packet proper (B). Mention Sasha and how the crystal ball states she already knows. The spectator will be curious what's being referred to, so explain they're about to find out by invoking a pretend curse on a pretend person, no one real or living.

Deal the next card face up on top of Sasha (C). Read out loud what it says to save the spectator the trouble and ask he make the choice of the curse either being for himself, maybe a personal reason, or is it as a favor for someone else. While this is going on obtain a pinky break below the top 2 cards. If he says it'll be for himself (mnemonic), front deal the top card face up onto the stack, read what it says and mention the marble color that's below 'SELF'. It will be your force color (D). If they say it's for someone else, remove 2 cards together as 1 (made easy due to the break) off the top and rotate face up onto the stack. This double deal is literally invisible due to the right hand's organic coverage and near immediate camouflaging on the stack. Mention the ball color below the word 'OTHER', again the force color!

It's as simple as that. You basically walk them down through the packet and force each color required for your voodoo doll's needle location, using either a single turnover or a double turnover so it's under their response. There's a simple rule of thumb ensuring you don't accidentally deal face up an unwanted card: If you dealt a single for the force next deal a double, or vice verse, if you dealt a double for the force next deal a single. The mnemonic makes it effortless in determining whether to deal a single or double because your force colors are on the single deals. If they say the mnemonic word, single deal. If they say the other word, double deal. Use this process through all 3 choices, which will end with the legend card showing (E). Assist them in finding the body part that has the 3 color combination matching the spectator's. Mention the body part and remind him about the first card saying that Sasha already knows, after a brief pause deal the last card face up on the stack to conclude (F). The packet is already reset as it doesn't get mixed during the process. For a repeat later, simply change the needled doll and arrange the 3 choices accordingly. I recommend getting 6 marbles that match in color and each time for him to hold, maybe antique your cards and get an old looking bag to keep everything in.



























